## **Dear Member Councils**

A belated Happy New Year to you all. It has been a very busy start to the New Year for everyone. I hope you find the latest edition of my Bulletin helpful and would welcome feedback (chief.executive@kentalc.gov.uk) so that I can refine it for the next edition.

- Government consultation on strengthening police powers to tackle unauthorised encampments as highlighted in the November and December 2019 issues, on Tuesday 5 November Government launched a consultation on new powers to criminalise unauthorised encampments, see <a href="https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/strengthening-police-powers-to-tackle-unauthorised-encampments">https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/strengthening-police-powers-to-tackle-unauthorised-encampments</a>. We would encourage all member councils to respond to this consultation. The closing date is 4 March 2020.
- National Transport and Highways Survey 2019/20 Councils across the UK are asking residents to tell them what they think of transport and roads services in their area. The National Highway and Transport Network have provided 6 independent surveys. You do not have to take them all. Each survey will only take a few minutes of you time. They are asking for views on accessibility; roads maintenance; public transport; road safety; tackling congestion; and walking and cycling. The surveys close on 29 February 2020. See

- Kent County Council (KCC) Strategic Statement 5 Year Plan: KCC has issued a
  consultation on its 5-year draft plan, which is the flagship strategy for the Council. It
  aims to unite the Council with clear outcomes and objectives. We would encourage

  The closing date for responses to KCC is 17 February 2020.

The select committee will gather information via hearing sessions with relevant witnesses and collect written submissions from experts and interested stakeholders. However, we have been in contact with KCC and they have agreed to extend the deadline to 9 February 2020.

  how they do this, what they think about and what they then do with the information, It
